- A) The Modern Olympic Games were first held in 1896 in Athens, G R E E C E.

- B) Norway has won 160 medals in what is now referred to as the Summer Olympics, from 1900 through 2020. Of those 160 medals, 32 were in sailing, 32 in S h o o t i n g, and 23 in track and field.

- C) The man who’s currently the King of Norway participated in sailing in the Summer Olympics of 1964 and was the flag bearer for the Norwegian team. His first name? H a r a l d.

- D) The Winter Olympics were first held in 1924 in Chamonix, France, although the sport of F i g u r e skating was included in the 1920 Summer Olympics.

- E) Norway has competed in every Winter Olympics, winning 368 medals (371 if the 1920 skating medals are counted), more than any other nation. Cross-country skiing (121), speed skating (84), and biathlon (41) are the top T h r e e sports in which Norwegians have medaled.

- F) In the early years of the Winter Olympics, Sonja Henie won gold in 1928, 1932, and 1936, cementing her fame as a figure skater and propelling her into roles in U. S. movies.

- G) Figure skating was the only womens’ winter sport until 1936, when alpine skiing was introduced. N o r d i c s k i i n g became an official sport for women in 1952.

- H) Snowboarding for men and women was added to the Winter Olympics in 1998. A f o u r of five new sports were added between 1992 and 2002.
